We have received the first Encyclical Letter of Pope Leo XIV on safeguarding the human person in an age of artificial intelligence. The Holy Father recalls the Encyclical Letter of Pope Leo XIII "Rerum Novarum" addressing "new things" and developing Catholic social teaching for the industrial age. Pope Leo XIV likewise draws upon the wisdom of the Gospel and the Church's timeless doctrine to interpret and address the challenges for humanity in a new age of artificial intelligence.

## Profession of Faith
